CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Important: Please note changes to items a & f to k.

- a) One entry per person per class except 'Any Other Variety' classes.
- b) Unless otherwise shown, prize money is: 1st \$10.00; 2nd \$5.00.
- c) A separate entry form is required for entries in the Cookery section and the Cooking in Jars! section.
- d) COOKERY ENTRIES MUST BE PRESENTED ON RIGID BOARDS OR STRONG DISPOSABLE PLATES. We suggest placing feet under rigid boards for ease of handling.
- e) Judges decisions are final and Judges reserve the right not to award prizes.
- f) Due to a small number of entries being chosen for public tasting at the Show, only about 50% of the selected items will be returned to those exhibitors at collection.
- g) Exhibits to be **collected only between 9.30am – 11am ON SUNDAY 2/2/20**. Those not collected will be disposed of after 11am Sunday 2/2/20.
- h) PRIZES ARE TO BE COLLECTED when exhibits are released on **SUNDAY 2/2/20 BETWEEN 9.30 – 11AM.**

- i) ROOKIE classes are for exhibitors who have not previously won a prize in that class.
- j) Any uncollected exhibits or prize money will no longer be taken to the Show Office for collection.
- k) Uncollected prize money will be held by Cookery sub-committee (see above) and if not claimed WITHIN THREE MONTHS will become a donation to the Stanthorpe Agricultural Society Inc. Prizes and prize money will not be mailed.
- l) Young Adult Cooks, 15yrs +. Those wishing to enter the cookery section are directed to enter the Adult Rookie or Open classes.

IMPORTANT! For a bit of fun 😊, the winning entry plus one other from a few selected classes from both Sections I & J will be made available for **PUBLIC TASTING**. This means that up to half of the selected items will be used in this process and so only the remaining part will be returned to the exhibitor.

ICED CAKES & SUGAR ARTISTRY

PLEASE NOTE, IMPORTANT CHANGE.

*Because Decorated Cakes are judged on the decoration (application and design) **we will now permit cake dummies** to be used as the basis for the decorated cakes. This is optional.*

CONDITIONS: *If a cake dummy is used, the shape/design of the cake must be such that the design would hold together if in fact cake had been used. In other words, shapes such as a circle standing upright would not be permitted as it would collapse if cake was used. This condition will apply to both Fondant iced cakes and Buttercream iced cakes. This option helps to reduce the weight of multi-tiered cakes and reduces cost of ingredients.*

The Sugar or Chocolate Artistry category is for items that are not cakes. You can create a floral arrangement or an individual artwork or scene, the choice is yours.

PLEASE PRESENT ALL ITEMS IN THESE CLASSES ON RIGID BOARDS WITH FEET.
